August 29th – RCCC's 38th Birthday Party and Luau – Tom had Terrie Neil speak about the club's charity, in conjunction with the Sheriff's Department, called Christmas for Kids. Terrie said the funds raised during the silent auction and the generous donations made by RCCC members goes toward buying food, clothing, bicycles, hygiene products and toys for families in need. Terrie also reminded members that food sources in the past, like Campbell Soup, were no longer available for the club to purchase food items for pennies on the dollar. She asked members to let her know of any sources known where the club charity could purchase discounted food, clothing, hygiene products and or toys. Last year the club's charity served 129 families and 462 children. These families are identified through the Sheriff's Department as well as through local schools as families in need and deserving of assistance. Terri also encouraged members to bring desserts to be placed in a separate silent auction with the proceeds going to the club. Terrie and Tom asked members to donate their craft items to the silent auction to benefit Christmas for Kids. Tom said it was a good way to show your skills and abilities to other members.

Tom Mason repeated and updated that the Club Birthday Luau Dinner and Club Charity Fund Raiser saying the Luau will be held in the BIG room at the Dante Club and will be at no cost to paid members.
